FVCA MISSION

COVERED CALIFORNIA

- Means Health Insurance for "All"
- Is designed with primary goal to expand health coverage for the general population

What about Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs?

WHAT DO WE KNOW?

- Families can no longer be denied health coverage because of a child's pre-existing condition
- 11% of CA children have an identified special health care need
- Creating a comprehensive, quality system of care for CSHCN is one of the most challenging areas for DHCS
- It is critical for policymakers, researchers and advocacy organizations to monitor the many issues important to CSHCN

INADEQUATE COVERAGE for CSHCN

- Non-covered benefits
- Limitations in duration and scope
- Annual or lifetime limits
- Excessive out of pocket expenses or children not receiving the care they need

BURDEN FOR FAMILIES

Out-of-pocket cost liabilities if the family is not eligible for subsidies (e.g. premium tax credits or reduced cost sharing):

- Premiums
- Co-payments
- Co-insurance
- Deductibles
- Uncovered services

Six Critical Systems Outcomes

(1) FAMILY/PROFESSIONAL PARTNERSHIP AT ALL LEVELS OF DECISION MAKING



(2) ACCESS TO COORDINATED COMPREHENSIVE CARE WITHIN A MEDICAL HOME



(3) IMPROVE ACCESS TO MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES



(4) ACCESS TO ADEQUATE PRIVATE AND/OR PUBLIC INSURANCE TO PAY FOR NEEDED SERVICES



(5) EARLY AND CONTINUOUS SCREENING FOR SPECIAL HEALTH NEEDS



(6) YOUTH TRANSITION TO ADULT HEALTH CARE, WORK, AND INDEPENDENCE
